

Application Deadline

- Mandatory pre-orientation info session: February 7
 - Anyone can attend, but only students that are in the term before Junior Status can apply.

- Fall Start Application Deadline: March 15th
 - Application is open from the time of orientation until March 15th.
 - You will be given a special code to apply

PROOF OF DEGREE:

Must be Junior status to apply.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA):

CREDENTIAL ONLY: 2.50 in all baccalaureate coursework.

PROCESSING FEE: \$25 Program application processing fee

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

Upload an essay 500-750 words in length (1-3 pages double spaced)
 Some questions to consider when formulating your essay:
 Why do you want to be a teacher?

• What experiences have prepared you to teach in a racially and linguistically diverse, urban setting?

What personal qualities do you possess and what experiences have you had that prepared you to work in a collaborative environment?

RESUME:

You may include information about your academic, employment, and volunteer experiences that are pertinent to your application and program objective.

EARLY FIELD EXPERIENCE:

- Applicants must show proof of completion of early field experience
 Single Subject: 20 hours in a high/middle school setting
 Field Experience Form
 Multiple Subjects: 30 hours in an elementary school setting
 Field Experience Form

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:

- Single Subject: 2 letters required
 Multiple Subjects: 2 letters required


TUBERCULOSIS (TB) TEST:

- TB test verification should be a photocopy of a note or card from a doctor.
- A negative skin test, blood test or a clear chest x-ray is acceptable.
- Verification should be valid at the time of application and while in the program.
- The term of validity from the time you took for a negative skin/blood test is four years and five years for the clear chest x-ray.

Single Subject Teaching Credential - Physical Education

The Integrated Program of Professional Preparation consists of a four-year Physical Education Teaching Education program. The Integrated Program comprises courses already offered in the Subject Matter program approved by the California Commission of Teaching Credentialing (CTC) and the Secondary Education Department.

Multiple Subjects Teaching Credential

Students completing Liberal Studies Integrated Teacher Preparation B.A. will graduate with both a B.A. and multiple subjects teaching credential with the additional option of completing a Bilingual Authorization for the state of California.

All ITEP candidates are required to attend the pre-Admissions Orientation. You must complete the Documents, Recommendations, and Questions sections of the Cal State Apply application for admission for consideration.

Interview

Faculty will interview applicants who meet the minimum qualifications for a credential program. Applicants who will be recommended for admission into the credential program will be notified within 2 months of the pre-admissions orientation and before registration for the subsequent semester.

What is the Commission (CTC)?

The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) is an agency in the Executive Branch of California State Government that was created in 1970 and is the oldest of the autonomous state standards boards in the nation. The major purpose of this agency is to serve as a state standards board for educator preparation for the public schools of California, the licensing and credentialing of professional educators in the State, the enforcement of professional practices of educators, and the discipline of credential holders in the State of California.

Types of California Teaching Credential issued by the Commission on Teacher Credential

Multiple Subject: The Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential authorizes the holder to teach all subjects in a self-contained classroom, such as classrooms in most elementary schools, in grades preschool or K-12.

<u>Single Subject</u>: The Preliminary Single Subject Credential authorizes the holder to teach a specific subject(s) named on the credential in departmentalized middle and high school.

Once you have completed the program (including Bachelor's degree) and additional state requirements listed above, you will need to apply for the preliminary credential.

You will be contacted by your credential analyst to apply for the award of your credential.

Credential Recommendations/Information

<u>EdTPA</u>: Educative Teacher Performance Assessment, is a performance-based, subject-specific assessment and support system used by teacher preparation programs throughout the United States to emphasize, measure and support the skills and knowledge that all teachers need from Day 1 in the classroom.

RICA (Multiple Subject ONLY): The purpose of the Reading Instruction Competence Assessment is to ensure that California-trained candidates for the Multiple Subject Teaching Credentials and Education Specialist Instruction Credential possess the knowledge and skills important for the provision of effective reading instructions to students.

Important Information

Student Teaching hours:

- Multiple Subject:
 - Phase I: 12 hours/week
 - Phase II: 12 hours/week
 - Phase III: 4 days/week
- Single Subject: to be discussed by the department

- Assessments: RICA, EdTPA
- GPA: Maintain a 3.0 GPA in credential coursework.
- Certificate of Clearance: required before student teaching. <u>Guide on how</u> <u>to apply.</u>

As a credential candidate, you are both an SFSU undergraduate student and post-baccalaureate student. Therefore, any required meetings, special events, and policies apply to you.
